

Impact of ConneXions Service

The ConneXions programme has now been operational for a year, in which we have supported many people affected by disability in the local area. There are 4 strands to the ConneXions programme which have ben funded by a Basingstoke and Deane Council grant of over £40,000 for the next three years, and Tesco Groundwork which supports the Films to Schools strand for one year.



ConneXions Talk

Takes place in a central location on the first Tuesday monthly. It is an opportunity for local people affected by disability to network and feel included and to reduce isolation in the community. Each session offers a speaker on relevant topics, the participants enjoy free refreshments in an informal setting. We also hold a ConneXions meeting at the Orchard café the third Wednesday of each month in conjunction with Timebank.

ConneXions Talk outreach offers a similar format to ConneXions central and is held once a month in deprived / rural areas in Basingstoke.

Financial information

The Profit & Loss together with the Balance Sheet for the year is included over the next couple of pages.

The Charity received an income of £26,384.97 with a profit of £13,154.54. Since it was anticipated that the Charity would be closing all Sales and Purchase Ledger items were dealt with within the year meaning that they both showed a zero balance.

A total of £7,772.60 was raised through our own fundraising efforts of the balance in the banks of £16,995.33, £6,733.77 is currently available for use. The balance being ring-fenced for various projects.

ConneXions Films to Schools

Films to Schools visit local primary schools to teach children a little more about disability. We show them two of the films we made starring local disabled children https://bddf.jimdo.com/resources/videos/ and provide an interactive workshop session.

We have so far visited six schools and over 350 children. We are currently relaunching the project as we were recently awarded a Tesco Groundwork grant for £2750, we are hoping to expand the project to older age groups and com-



munity based organisations. The children were given the opportunity to write a letter to a fictional child with a disability who would be joining their school. The winning letter would show empathy and inclusion.

Awareness Days

We held two disability awareness days in the Basingstoke area. Our main events are held in The Malls in the heart of the town centre. Where approximately 6000 people attended our summer Basingstoke Roll event. Approximately 1000 people attended the Disability Awareness Day in September where 25 partner organisations offered information and ad-

ConneXions Signposting

BDDF run the Disability Signpost Service. This is a drop by service where people affected by disability, their carers, and professionals by the team to someone or somewhere which will help them.

ConneXions Learning

Case study of service user by Amanda Knowles – BDDF – April 2019

Jaco's mum joined BDDF as a member in June 2018. Jaco and his mum Darleen quickly became involved with BDDF and volunteered with us at The Basingstoke Roll our annual charity fundraising event. They helped to run the wheelchair obstacle course which allowed non wheelchair users the opportunity to experience riding in or pushing a manual wheelchair around a course.

Jaco found this experience to be very rewarding because he could get involved in fundraising for a charity that he hugely benefits from. He enjoyed meeting people and showing them that you can have fun in a wheelchair. He also enjoyed meeting volunteers and people with a passion for the disabled.



Jaco then joined us on a Confidence Course, Anxiety Management course, a Budgeting / Money Management course, and is currently taking part in a further 'Be Confident in You' course we have organised with RCS. I contacted Jaco to ask him for some feedback about the courses he has attended with us and he had the following to say "I enjoy all the courses that the BDDF offer. It gives me an opportunity to improve myself and gain confidence. I can relax and learn with others in my situation. can safely share our issues and learn together. At the most recent 'Be Confident in You' session, people commented that I am more assertive and confident in taking the lead in a small group. This feedback had a very positive effect on me".

The experiences Jaco has had with BDDF have led him to be confident enough to take part in a Reverse Disability Jobs Fair which we were involved in setting up with Lisa Edwards from BDBC. Jaco had this to say about the event "on the Jobs Fair course I was helped to write the best CV and prepare for an interview. On the day of the Jobs Fair, the team helped me to relax and be more confident. The employers that were invited gave very useful information and feedback. Even though it did not lead to a job yet, I will definitely benefit from the experience in future".
