Key Stats and Facts – year in snapshot

- BDDF have supported over 3,500 people in Basingstoke and Deane Borough between 2019-20.
- Films to Schools. Taking our 2 videos into 14 local Primary schools and 3 Scout huts. Providing disability workshops to 3,169 pupils.
- ConneXions programme supported:
 - o 35 learners via our courses held in partnership with local learning providers
 - o 136 signpost enquiries
 - o 133 attendees to our talk & support sessions
 - 104 supported with physical activity
- Seated Yoga. New service as at Jan 2020, 96 attendees so far.
- Disability Awareness Days. Attracted 26 local organisations who support those living with disability.
- We extended our social media reach and surpassed 600
 Facebook followers. Important step to help reach more people and share the services available.



BDDF – Who We Are

BDDF formed in 2008 with a mission to support the local disabled community to reach its potential in Basingstoke. At the last census, 1 in 5 people identified as having a disability, and there was no clear organisation representing them. In addition, there was a gap in the accessibility of services available as well as a lack of inclusion or opportunities for less-abled people. BDDF was founded by a group of residents living with disabilities with the aim of supporting the community, giving them a voice and addressing the stigma.

With over 24,426 people in Basingstoke and Deane living with a disability we're committed to offering a programme of core services that are relevant, impactful and empowering.

Services & Activities - all are free to attend

Films to Schools (3,169 supported)

BDDF created 2 films starring local children living with disability, who helped us to bring the key messages to life. Watch the videos - Here

'Films to Schools' takes these films into local primary schools to teach children a little more about disability and provide an interactive workshop session. The children were then given the opportunity to write a letter to a fictional child with a disability who would be joining their school. The winning letter would show empathy and inclusion.

BDDF have so far visited 14 Primary Schools and 3 Cub Packs six schools and reached over 3,000 children mainly at Key Stage 2.

Looking to relaunch the project as we were recently awarded a Tesco Groundwork grant, we are hoping to expand the project to older age groups and community-based organisations.

Disability Awareness Day (EST. 7,000 attendees)



Our main event sees BDDF partnering with local organisations, highlighting disability services available in the community. BDDF held two disability awareness days in The Malls in the heart of the town centre.

Approximately 6000 people attended our summer Basingstoke Roll event and a further 1000 people attended the Disability Awareness Day in September. Thank you to the 26 local partner organisations who offered information to attendees.

ConneXions

This is the second year of our 3-year funding programme, kindly supported by Basingstoke & Deane Borough Council.

ConneXions - Signposting (136 supported)

Signposting is an information service available for people with a disability, their family and friends. Supporting those who do not know which way to turn about a disability query or issue. Providing useful information on subjects such as transport, benefits, education, activities. Requests for help are received in person, via telephone, email and Facebook Messenger.

ConneXions Talk meetings (133 supported)



A monthly networking programme promoting inclusion and alleviating social isolation. Providing an opportunity for local people affected by disability to network and feel included and to reduce isolation in the community. Each session offers a speaker on relevant topics, the participants enjoy free refreshments in an informal setting.

Guest Speakers are invited to showcase local groups and services and to help our members build skills and a network locally. Guest speaker examples; a Time Bank volunteer, Glass Maidens, The Army Flying Museum

Courses offered (35 supported)

Offering Learning via bite-sized training and development programmes focused on education, personal skills, confidence and employability. Learning opportunities offered to our members through our partnership with RCS. The courses are held in central and district locations, listed are examples of some of the courses this year:

Money Management ◆ IT ◆ Anxiety Management ◆ Employability ◆ Confidence Building

Time For You

A 6-week course. Led by qualified life coach – covering meditation and mindfulness to provide skills to manage emotions and stress.

Chronic Pain Support Group

Offered within the community both of an evening and afternoon, these groups look to bring together people living with chronic pain, to create a safe space to talk about the difficulties this brings, share help and advice and to forma social network group they can each lean on outside of BDDFs meetings.

Physical activity (104 supported):

Fun Fit Friday



One-off sports and physical activity event for children with disabilities and their siblings, aged from 5 to 18. It took place in Basingstoke Sports Centre and was supported by Hampshire FA and Irwin Mitchell Solicitors. The all-day event during the Christmas holidays in December 2019 saw groups of up to twelve per group take part in football practice and 'boot camp' style activities.

Mobility Improving - Seated Yoga

Led by the fantastic Marzia from Cherry Yoga. Starting in January 2020. BDDF provided open to all seated yoga & meditation sessions within the community. It is understood that yoga promotes mobility while reducing stress and anxiety.

"Marzia was very welcoming and made a perhaps daunting thought into a very relaxed, welcoming and enjoyable experience. There was no pressure to take part in all aspects, but do what you are comfortable with, and within your ability. It opens up the opportunity to be able to help yourself, with others. I never know how much breathing and movements I am able to do even with restrictions. What a fab class. Thank you"

Financial update - April 1st, 2019 - March 31st, 2020

- Copies of our annual accounts may be requested by emailing info@bddf.org.uk
- In the previous financial year, it was anticipated that the BDDF would be closing. However renewed efforts were made to continue operating, including an interim Chair and refreshing of the board.
- The Charity continued operating generating an income of £17,869 however costs exceeded income generating a loss of £6,560 in the financial year.
- Cash funds remained healthy at £16,982 (restricted funds: £10,312)
- Decision was made in the year to increase head count to hire a targeted fundraiser. Whilst we are confident this is the right strategy long term; in the initial year, the outlay did not translate through to increased income.
- Ongoing the main task is to generate more income and self-fund raise.
- Confirm there has been no spending outside of England and Wales.
- Confirm there were no serious incidents that may or may not have been reported in the last year.

Grants & Fundraising

- Total Grants income of £14,677. Key grants included:
 - Basingstoke and Deane Council awarded BDDF a community grant to run our ConneXions Programme 2018-2021. Totalled £13,989 for this financial period.
 - Groundworks (Tesco) supporting Films for Schools (£2,750), Tesco bags of help (£688)
 - Magic Little Grants supporting Yoga (£500)
- Total fundraising activities in the year amounted to £1,452. Key activities included a quiz and coin collections at Tesco Chineham. Thank you to all who volunteer, attended and donated.
